# Around the Conferences

## Glasgow Archdiocese

### A Centenarian's Life in Vincentian Service

Written by Glasgow Archdiocesan President, Joe Maguire

Vincent Joseph Larmour was born on 30 January 1922. In the same month the SSVF Conference he would later join and remain with for the rest of his Vincentian life received its aggregation - St Constantine's parish in Govan. Vincent joined the Society in 1957. Married and with ten children we wondered how he ever found the time but this he did. He describes the Society as 'the most important thing in life' for him next

to his family and as he tells us this, he goes on to relate how he nearly did not join. He had gone along to a parish meeting that was seeking recruits

for the Children of Mary. When he left the meeting, he had joined the SSVF! The next 50 years or so would see him work tirelessly for the poor in the parish of Govan and Glasgow beyond, before retiring from the Society in May 2008.

He remembers his early visits to homes in the parish and tells us of the visit he made to a woman who possessed a kettle and some cups, nothing else, and with a family to feed.

As his experience and service grew, he readily accepted responsibility of various offices in the Society; President, Treasurer and Secretary, Glasgow Convenor for Hospital Visits, culminating in becoming Glasgow Archdiocesan President in 1998. There were other interests too. He was involved in the setting up of the Glasgow Furniture Project based at Polmadie and could be found every Saturday in September

at the local bank branch assiduously emptying the boxes filled during the day's Flag Day operation.

With pride he informs us that his Conference was the first in Glasgow to introduce female membership into the Society and it is clear how important women have become in the Society ever since that introduction confounding the sceptics and indeed some Bishops too. Much has changed in his time. In 1957 there was no National Council in existence, no female members as yet and very little adequate social security support to the poor in Glasgow. Govan he maintains was an area that evinced

a strong community spirit and this saw frequent interaction with fellow Christian organisations in an effort to make living conditions better.

How did Vincent do all this and yet raise ten children? The answer lies with his wife Betty who died three years ago and mention of her brings a warm pride in his voice. We take our leave and the smile is back on his face. Let us remember him and all those Members like him who have contributed more than enough to the continued work of the Society.

## St Andrew's & Edinburgh Archdiocese

In November, Archbishop Cushley celebrated the Society of St Vincent de Paul's annual Archdiocesan Mass at St Patrick's, Cowgate, Edinburgh.

He told Members: *"I'm very pleased that you have been able to maintain outreach to those in need, as well as those who find themselves alone and depressed because of Covid. You have been able to help them not only by practical support but by simply being there."*

# Galloway Diocese

**St Mary's, Irvine** has resumed its regular cycle of fortnightly meetings and is again playing an active role through organising support for and donations to the North Ayrshire Food Bank. Their Members have responded to requests for help from those in crisis situations by providing food parcels, travel costs, bedding, items of personal hygiene, as well as supporting the alleviation of gas and electricity charges where appropriate. Support was also offered to local primary schools to assist families with school uniforms.



**Our Lady of Mount Carmel,** Kilmarnock provided local primary school pupils with clothing and a backpack containing individually requested items (slippers, pens, pencils, notebooks, bath towel, toiletries, etc). The class teacher was delighted with the response and the children fed back they were excited to have things the same as their classmates. They also provided parcels of boxed biscuits, selection boxes and grocery vouchers to 66

families (with a total of 116 children) identified through liaison with local schools and early childhood centre at Christmas.

**St Margaret's, Ayr** were given a kind donation from the Knights of Malta of clothes, cold weather essentials and toiletries for distribution over the Christmas period.

# Aberdeen Diocese

**The Cathedral Conference** has been running a foodbank for years in which they buy in food, parcel it up and distribute it on a Tuesday afternoon from the Cathedral car park. By setting up tables in the car park, they have provided donated food and distributed 80 parcels. They rely heavily on food donations and cash for food purchases. The foodbank moved into the car park at the beginning of the Covid outbreak, and

rain or shine they have been handing out food there every week.

**St. Columba's, Aberdeen** have been visiting people in Sheltered Housing and in their own homes, whilst delivering food parcels to peoples' homes, from Holy Family Sisters of the Needy. They have also been providing food



and taking a turn cooking a hot meal in St. Mary's Cathedral hall for those requiring support.

his work and wish him good health. COVID has impacted us all and in particular it has made it difficult for us to visit the needy in their homes, and restricted Conference meetings. As we now ease restrictions I hope that we can all return to regular face to face Conference meetings and I look forward to meeting everyone and discussing how to help grow into bigger and stronger groups.

With all that is happening in the world at present, I know that the need to help families and individuals, with rising living costs is apparent to all. Then there are also the refugees

who have been forced to flee from their homeland and some are seeking safety in our Diocese.

All of this will place an increased workload on all our SSVF Members.

I am very conscious young people are kept busy with work and family commitments, but I wonder if some would be willing to spend one hour or so per month to help with serving the less well off or the lonely in their community."

## Motherwell Diocese

The Furniture Project continues to thrive, it has gone from strength to strength. This is due to the dedication and hard work of the Volunteers.

It is a continuous cycle of receiving, checking goods and redistributing goods which keeps everyone extremely busy.

The generosity of so many people in donating items means that we have a fully loaded unit with a wide range of good quality household items. Since the beginning of this year, deliveries have been made to over 30 families

many of whom received multiple items with an average turnaround time of 2-3 days. They also uplifted items from 40 homes.

They have also been able to assist our Brothers and Sisters at the Paisley Unit with items of furniture. Any unusable items are recycled ensuring nothing is wasted.

As Conferences begin to resume their activities, look out for their Open Day for Members to go and visit the Unit. They are always looking for new volunteers, if you are interested, please give them a call for more information.

## **The 'International Themed Years' Project**

The Council General, with the 'International Themed Years' Project, strengthens its commitment to increase understanding of the lives of the seven founders of our beloved Society of St Vincent de Paul. So far, the years have covered: 2017 (Bailly de Surcy), 2018 (Lallier), 2019 (Lamache), 2020 (Clavé) and 2021 (Devaux).

### **Who was Le Taillandier?**

Pierre-Auguste Le Taillandier was born in Rouen, France, on 28 January 1811. He was one of the seven friends who founded the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul in Paris, on 23 April 1833. Le Taillandier moved with his family to Paris, where he could complete his legal studies. He joined the 'Conferences of History' with Frédéric Ozanam and

spoke out in favour of carrying out a more practical, beneficial kind of work. Ozanam describe him a "very amiable, well-informed young man, full of common sense". In 1833, he played an active part in founding the first Conference. He also gave religious instruction to aspirant Catholics during home visits and visits to prisoners. He was the first of the young founders to receive the sacrament of matrimony, marrying Marie Baudry on 7 August 1838. They had four children, three girls and a boy.

In Rouen, he was a Director of an insurance company, and of a hospital. In 1841, he founded the Rouen Conference of Saint Godard, becoming its President. He was very popular with his fellow Conference Members, and

with his fellow-citizens, receiving many marks of recognition, although he was never bothered about them. He spent his final days devoted to his family, to the education of his children, with his friends, the Conference and his beloved garden at home. Pierre-Auguste Le Taillandier died in the city of his birth on March 23rd, 1886, at the age of 75.

The shortage of resources faced by many countries where the Society is established promotes a spirit of Vincentian sharing. Conferences and Councils help each other, both nationally and internationally. This bond consists of sharing prayer, deep friendship and material resources, and is known as Twinning; it helps to create links among the various countries in the Confederation.

## St Jude's Conference – Vredenburg, Twinned with St Conval's Conference, Pollok

Further to the initial report in the previous edition, we have received an in-depth report of the good work done by one of our South African Twins, which is 146km, on

the coast north of Cape Town. St Conval's Conference are lucky having a Twin who can produce this quality of reporting, but it gives us a great insight into the use that can be made of our £30 a quarter from the various Twinning Conferences. From the donations they receive, including Twinning they work with a few other parishes and run projects to assist schools, run feeding stations, help the aged and the unemployed.

The heartache of the war in Ukraine is on our TV screens 24 hours a day! There is an on-going war in Tigre, Ethiopia, Sudan, Yemen, Somalia, Libya, drug wars in Mexico. In fact 174 countries were at war in some form or another in 2021.

The conflict in Ethiopia has seen many Christians, including seven Daughters of Charity, imprisoned. I'm sure many more of our Vincentian brothers and sisters are affected by wars in their area. Our hearts and prayers go out to our sisters and brothers in all of these countries.

Sadly, we only seem to take stock of the wars that are likely to have an effect on us.

The conflict between Russia and Ukraine is close to us, has pushed up the price of petrol and fuel for us and more importantly, this conflict has the potential to be disastrous for the whole of Europe.

As Vincentians we're also aware of 'conflicts' within families, the families we support, the families in our parish area, etc.

There are always consequences of conflict, so what is our response?

As Vincentians, solidarity with those who are suffering is a hallmark of our charism. It was wonderful to hear that the SSVF in

Perth are standing alongside the Polish community to do a Rosary pilgrimage for the people of Ukraine on the Feast of St Joseph.

The many branches of the Vincentian Family are responding in so many ways, some opening their houses and chapels to the new poor this conflict has created.

There are many people responding in many 'practical' ways, but one way we can all respond is through prayer.

Prayer is always the foundational response to all needs. Jesus told the disciples, **"I assure you that whatever you ask the Father, He will give you in my name."** (Jn 16:23)

The seven Daughters of Charity imprisoned in Ethiopia were released after about three months... thanks to the power of prayer.
