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
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INTRODUCTION

The society's prayers enshrine all aspects of Vincentian Spirituality, and nourish our spiritual lives as they are said slowly and reflectively.

This prayer allows us to grow closer to God and to care deeply for those in need. St Vincent de Paul said "Give me a person of prayer and they will be capable of anything"

Fredrick Ozanam and his original companions were concerned about the human and social implications as they established the Society. At the same time they felt the urgent need for a spiritual foundation for their mission. The harmonious balance between prayer and activity which Vincent de Paul achieved draws its inspiration, strength and fidelity from a life of faith.

The Vincentian vocation sees itself in this 20th century of science, technology and efficiency as a humble yet authentic witness to fraternal charity and social initiative.

The poverties of loneliness, hopelessness and loss of self esteem are endemic in our sacralised society of today, so time, advice and support given with an open heart and generous spirit are the priceless Vincentian gifts we offer to people on our visitations.

This prayer book is not intended to replace our personal and intimate conversations with God but rather to help on those occasions when words fail us.

By our prayer and action may we wrap this world in charity to fill Fredrick's vision for the poor, always remembering that the deeper we love the deeper we pray.

Not only should work be allotted and plans made for works of charity, but spiritual refreshment should be gained, and each person's relationship with Christ deepened. The growth in holiness of each member is essential to the Society and will give the only true dimension worthy of its work. A Conference meeting devoid of spiritual food is a poor meeting, and unworthy of the Society.

A passage containing some message should be chosen, read, and a few moments of silence should be allowed for reflection after the reading. A discussion of the reading can then take place for five or ten minutes.

Topic and Discussion

Some topic on one or other aspect of the Society's work can be chosen, outlined by the President, then discussed for five or ten minutes. In this way the proper motivation of the works of the Society is kept always before the members.

- What distinguishes the Society from other charitable societies?
- Are we adopting our work sufficiently to the modern world and its specific needs, especially the needs of OUR parish?
- Have we become TOO parochial, or do we take part in National and Diocesan activities to show our solidarity with the local Church?
- Are we faithful to the performance of the corporal works of mercy?
- "Courtesy is the sign of the grace of God" is this true of us in our work in Church and in the homes of the needy?
- Is there another Conference which needs our help?
- Do we spread the Vincentian spirit throughout the Parish and the Diocese?
- Do we play our part in the life of the community as a whole?
- Are there sufficient young people in our Conference – if not, why not?
- Are we faithful in helping the Diocesan and National Council, in our twinning? Do we pray for our "twin" as well as sending it funds?
- Are we faithful in administering our funds, the money given by the people who wish to help the poor?
- Have we too large a bank balance? Are we poor enough?
- Do we use the common bond of charity to be truly ecumenical?

Business

The business of the meeting should be carried out efficiently, as any other meeting nowadays. Minutes of last meeting, apologies for absence, correspondence received, financial report, discussion of works done and to be done, other competent business.

NOTE

No member should talk too much, unless asked to render a report he has been commissioned to prepare: no one, not even the President, should "hog" the meeting.

Should any difficult problem arise, why not stop for a moment's silent prayer on the matter, then proceed with the solution. In other words, the whole meeting can take on the form of shared prayer, with business interlaced. It should be no ordinary meeting – but a sharing of experience, ideals and practical suggestions and plans, with the spirit of charity pervading. Avoid criticism. Use the grace of the priesthood to help if the Spiritual Adviser is present.

Prayers During The Day

The secret is to "tune in to God" as you can throughout each day. Things around you and people will help. See something beautiful and think of God, thanking Him for His creation. See people and see Christ in them, marvel at His goodness, treat them as you would treat Him, and thank God for another reflection of His glory.

Situations will arise when prayer comes easily: in trouble, in temptation, in a difficult situation.

PRAY for this almost constant awareness of the presence of God around you – then you will pray hundreds of times each day.

Mere suggestions are noted here: some of your prayers will be the time-worn ones, others will be spontaneous if you are in that kind of mood; this Prayerbook may help you fill in some specific need – but only brief outlines are given – guidelines.

Morning Prayers

- 1. Thanks be to God for being alive today!
- 2. A prayer of offering
- 3. A thought and a resolution for the day. Sometimes to listen regularly to a radio programme helps the habit of early morning worship.
- 4. Is daily Mass and Communion beyond you or twice-weekly?

PRAYERS BEFORE AND AFTER MEALS, PRAYERS WHEN PASSING (OR NOT PASSING) A CHURCH, PRAYERS FOR INSPIRATION OR IN A TIGHT CORNER, PRAYERS AT THE SIDE OF THE SICKBED. Ask God to enlighten you when and how to pray.

Night Prayers

- 1. A review of the day and examination of conscience. What about that resolution made? What about the Achilles heel, your special weakness? How often have you turned to God?
- 2. Some of the older prayers, to Our Lady, for a happy death, for particular people who need prayers.
- 3. A little sorrow, adoration, thanksgiving and a few petitions.
- 4. "Sleep is death's young brother". Sleep each night as though you were really ready to enter heaven.

BUT please do not restrict yourselves to morning and night prayers and grace before and after meals. The HABIT of prayer is not really a difficult one to form, if you have the will, and constantly ask God to help you form it. It is not impossible to live constantly in the presence of God – try it and see.

Some people are helped greatly by EJACULATIONS – the Holy Name, invoking the saints, especially those for whom you have a special admiration. The names of saints are all around us borne by other people.

DEVOTIONS – to the Sacred Heart, to the Rosary, to Our Lord in the Tabernacle, to the saints have been a great help to people throughout the ages. Have you one? Your dealings with other people will bring you into constant contact with Christ, for EVERYMAN is Christ to you – and you must treat him accordingly. "As often as you do this to the least of My brethren, you do it to Me."



Let us but raise the level of religion in our own hearts, and it will rise in the world. (Newman)

HOSPITAL VISITATION

THE QUESTION

Body broken: spirits low: pride hurt: independence lost: worried about those at home: worried about work: what does the future hold? why had God asked me to suffer? how long will it last? will I ever be the same again?

THE ANSWER

Bodies can be mended, spirits raised: humility is truth and a great gift: gracious dependence, cheerful victimhood: God will provide for the present, and the future is in His hands: Christ suffered more and wishes you to share His suffering: never will He allow you to suffer beyond your strength: never the same again? no, BETTER through suffering: more dependent on God's strength: greater sympathy and compassion for others in future: now a smaller but soon a bigger person will emerge from suffering.

The Prayer

O Lord, best sufferer of all time, help me understand the sufferings I am about to witness around me.

Teach me to offer the help most needed,

to say the right things,

to sympathise and console,

to strengthen and encourage,

to say the word of comfort and cheer.

Teach me to spread Your love in this place of sickness,

to listen to suffering, to explain suffering, to reassure and turn pessimism to optimism, to see You in suffering humanity, You, crucified You. You at Your best, You at Your strongest. These are poor souls, yet privileged and noble souls, these are called to imitate You more intimately. These are Your special friends. Give me strength to pass on some strength to them. Use me as the instrument of Your love. and enrich and ennoble me through contact with those who share Your cross. Sword-pierced Mary, tender and understanding Mother, be with me as I try to give myself to your suffering children.

HOUSE VISITATION

THE QUESTION

Poverty, squalor, bad management, illness, cruelty, deprivation, loneliness, lack of Faith, despair, loss of dignity, weakness of drugs and drink – NEED all around, desperate need . . .

THE ANSWER

The frailty of man, limitation and weakness, loss of courage, lack of perseverance – yet strength of God providing in strange and mysterious ways, restoring courage, granting perseverance, supplying help and companionship: raising fallen mankind with Him from death to resurrection, through suffering to glory. God will provide: I must co-operate to rise, strong with His strength.

THE PRAYER

O God, someone in this house needs me.
I don't know how I will be received,
but I go as Your ambassador,
however unworthy and weak I am myself.
Give me Your power to help in the best way possible,
offering what is needed,
giving the proper advice,
saying the right thing.
I am Your servant
and the servant of anyone who needs me.

I am weak – You can make me strong:
I am tongue-tied – You can supply my words:
I lack courage – You can reinforce me:
I am perplexed – You can give the answer:
I am useless – You can make me useful.
Above all, make me recognise You in these people, and seeing You let me love them as I love You.
They need Your love, they need my love, let's love them together.
I'll do my best:
be with me in what is Your work, and mine.

Kind, gentle, understanding Saint Vincent de Paul, inspire me in all my dealings with the needy whom you knew, understood and loved so much.

To pray is to ask Christ to let me know His will for me, and to follow it with courage, determination and joy.

PRISON VISITATION

THE QUESTION

Man's weakness: temptation unresisted: crime committed: regret: bitterness: shame and disgrace: loss of dignity: spirit broken: grudge against society: why ME?

THE ANSWER

Man can regain strength – can become even stronger than before: resistance to temptation can be built up: crime repented: resolution to do better: bitterness only at self-weakness: shame and disgrace will pass – all men are frail and fall often: dignity is always ours as sons of God can be increased by nearness to God and God's laws: spirit can be revived with prayer and the sacraments, and humble acceptance of counselling: society is good, and bad: be on the better side from now on.

I have been unwell but my recovery can lead to renewed strength and vigour for what is right.

Prayer

Lord, You fell three times under the cross, but You got up three times: teach me to help prisoners to rise up again!

I may never have been in prison, Lord, but I often wonder have I really deserved to be! At least I have this in common with the prisoners: I have often yielded to temptation.

So I have something in common with them for a start.

Give me the light to see the dignity of man,

even in men who have fallen in other men's esteem.

Give me the wisdom to comfort, to counsel and console without seeming self-righteous or patronising.

Help me, Lord, to be genuine and sincere,

to be understanding and humble.

If I can help, show me how.

If I cannot help, at least I can be riend.

If I cannot befriend, at least I can seem to CARE.

No matter how I am received, even with cynicism and resentment,

give me strength and courage to return to bring YOU to men who need YOU in their loneliness. AMEN

TWINNING

THE QUESTION

Inequality of man; inadequacy of development, of organisation, of resources, of health services. Lack of communications leads to lack of awareness: lack of awareness leads to lack of care: cries from afar go unanswered. We can be smug and self-complacent and selfish, "We're all right: let them look after themselves..."

THE ANSWER

Men can share: modern communications can help us learn about the lack in undeveloped lands far away, and lead us to share our riches and stability with their poverty and instability: we must become AWARE, then CARE – first by prayer, then by material gifts, prayer in action. Charity knows no bounds: there are always many in need abroad as well as at home. They cry out to us for often there is no solution from within. They depend on us: we must turn to them and feed them as Christ fed all His children. Awake, then, to awareness: stretch out a helping hand to those far off: let their distant cries of HELP! be answered by YOU.

The Prayer

God of all creation, Father of all men, Your family is so large it contains rich and poor, healthy and unhealthy, those who have and those who have not.

We can often become self-satisfied and uncaring: at most we can be aware of the needs of those around us,

our families, our town, our country.

Show us clearly the needs of others in far off lands.

Your love shows no bounds:

You befriended all in need, despite the cost to Yourself.

You lived and died for all men.

Put into me a caring heart like Yours – all embracing.

Teach me first to pray for all in need,

for prayer, like love, knows no boundaries.

Then give me the vigour to put my prayer into action – action by giving till it hurts,

giving to those I shall never meet,

but who still NEED me to share with them

what much or what little I have.

All men are, in a sense, my TWINS.

Let not the healthy twin neglect his unhealthy brother.

AMEN.

THE QUESTION

Words, words, words – procedure – voting – motions and counter-motions – minutes and HOURS – report from sub-committee – plan for action – other competent business – words, words, WORDS.

THE ANSWER

The WORD was made flesh and dwelt amongst us. Words can be fine, especially when shot through with charity. Talking must come before planned action. Short, to the point, prepared agendas prepared interventions — POSITIVE and CHARITABLE and CONSTRUCTIVE help edify, build up. YOU are present, so exercise the Apostolate of the Presence. Christ is present too, in Himself, in the others around you, in every word spoken and every decision made. Hold your meetings around Him. Let Him be the centre of all you say, then ACTION will result.

The Prayer

Lord Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh, Teach us to speak the things which are wise and kind. Be present at our meeting and inspire us with the right words to speak and the right decisions to take. Our decisions will concern You, They will concern You present in other people, So be with us as we meet. Teach us when to speak and when to be silent. Let us be kind in what we say.

Let our suggestions be constructive and for Your glory. Prevent us from speaking to hear our own voices. Be on our lips, in our words, guiding our minds to express what is right and for the general good. And open our ears to hear what is said by others.

Defend us from uncharitable thoughts.

Enrich us by ideas and suggestions granted to others. In times of difficulty – elections, decisions, financial problems – let us turn again to You for a moment to be enlighted and guided.

And help us to ACT in accord with what we say. Lord Jesus, the Word made flesh, Let Your presence ABOUND at this our meeting.

Kind and gentle St Francis de Sales, teach us to use our power of speech worthily in the cause of Christ and for the benefit of the people of God. AMEN.

THE DIFFICULT SITUATION

THE QUESTION

How can I face this problem I have been asked to solve? Others have tried to solve it and have failed. Why me now? I am not Solomon, I have had little experience of this difficulty. Other people would be better than I could ever be. Besides, what will the reaction be to my solution? There seems no answer. I am in the dark and very frightened.

THE ANSWER

Who are you, alone? Useless, inefficient, inadequate, alone. What will YOUR solution be? Wrong, unsatisfactory, even harmful. But you are not alone. You are a mere ambassador, a messenger from Christ. You convey His help, His solution. Rely on Him, for He alone can solve problems. He will teach you how to act, what to say. You cannot go it alone. But you are NOT alone: He is with you. TRUST HIM, lean on Him. The more you depend on Him the stronger you will be. Go forward now into battle. He is at your side and you will not fail.

The Prayer

Courageous Lord, be with me now, Sent as I am on a difficult errand, I fully realise my own shortcomings and inadequacies. I am not able to see any solution, any way out of the mist. I am of myself totally useless.

Therefore I need help.

Come to my aid and guide me through the mist.

Teach me what to do and say.

The advice I shall give will be Yours, not my own.

Work through me, but please, You work,

using me as Your instrument of good.

I am afraid of the fog,

Only You can be my Light through it.

Stand by me, be in my mouth, my eyes, my understanding.

Use me as You will, how You will, when You will. But do not abandon me and leave me alone.

I have never needed You more.

All reliable Lord, I rely on You.

The blind, the lame, the crippled and the weak must all depend on God if their lives seem fruitless and unavailing. I am blind, lame and crippled: I am the weakest of men. Lord, by the intercession of the saint whose name I am proud to bear, be my strength and make up for my weakness. AMEN.

Help us in this hour of crisis, the help that man can give is worthless. (Ps. 60,11)

THE ELECTION

THE QUESTION

Whom should I vote for? There is nobody to replace the one who went before. There's just no one the same around. Others talk of X, but he/she's not for me. Will I myself have a chance of election? I could do the job well, but many will not even consider me: it's an unjust world and all the wrong folks are elected. It's a puzzle. Maybe I should abstain? And if I'm not elected maybe I should leave – they may give me a vote of noconfidence. Anyway, I would only get involved in more meetings, more work. What shall I do at this election?

THE ANSWER

There is a serious job to be done today, I must play my part in getting the right person. Who is he/she? The one God wants. And that may well be the least competent in our eyes, the unexpected: it happens so often. So, not listening to what has been said, I say a prayer and vote for whoever I think best of the eligibles, despite my opinions about them. Myself? I think I'm the best: some of them will actually vote for me. If they only knew. I'm the worst — I KNOW that. Ambition? Unworthy of any Society let alone one which is bound to service and unobtrusive life. God may play the joke of seeing that I am elected — and I will try to do the job — but I know myself and know that such ambition is false. No — I go forward confidently, vote for who I think will fit the bill, then lend that person my

The Prayer

The task for which You were chosen, Lord, was hardly an enviable one, but You did the will of the One Who sent You, for sheer obedience as the sign of immensity of love.

Help us choose the right person for the right task today. Let us not be influenced by one another, but by You. Reign over our election and guide our choice.

Defend me personally from all ambition or false ideas about my own worth.

Teach me my worthlessness, even by humiliation. Be with all those who vote, and free them from themselves

Be with our Society and guide it with right leadership. The unexpected may happen.

But You know what You're about.

Help me, then, Lord, choose the right person,

Then give me the strength and the humility to be of service to the one chosen – for You will have guided that choice and You I serve.

Let all discussion then end, and true loyalty and service begin.

St Matthias, last and most unexpected of the apostles, help guide our elections today. Help us see God's providence at work, even in strange ways. Your entry to the college of apostles was remarkable. But let us see the hand of God today, accept His will and pledge our loyalty to His choice.

O Lord, Thou knowest how busy I must be today; if I forget Thee, do not Thou forget me. AMEN.

Self

Conquer yourself, and the world is at your feet. (St Augustine)

A Time and Place for Everything

Things done at the proper time, things kept in the proper place: this is a form not only of efficiency and time-saving, but of great charity.

Time is so precious: idleness so unholy. Wear yourself in service to others: be tired at the end of your day, tired at the end of your life.

Look Outwards

Spend your time looking OUTWARDS to others, not INWARDS to yourself.

Obedience

Children are not the only ones called to obedience: the call comes to adults many times each day – obedience to the laws of God, the laws of the land (traffic laws, for example), obedience at work, obedience to the demands, reasonable or unreasonable, of others. And obedience is the practical sign of LOVE – "If you love Me, keep My commandments."

It's Now that Matters

"The NOW moment is the moment of destiny:" not the past, not the future, but the HERE AND NOW. Fulfil it well with all your strength and you will be accumulating great rewards.

Prayer

Prayer keeps open the line to God: it can be so varied, so active and so passive, so formal and so informal. Never cease to pray.

Be sure that the Lord will never forsake those who love Him when they run risks solely for His sake.

Self-Control

Strive always for self-control. The space-ship out of control is highly dangerous: man is a complicated being too, and is more dangerous than any machine out of control. Spend your whole life controlling yourself, your speech, your activity, your temper, your work and recreation.

Balance

Man must be constantly seeking for true BALANCE in life – balance between work and play, between prayer and activity, between silence and speaking: the saints were balanced people.

Dreams and Ideals

For sure, be realists – but never lose your dreams and idealism: life would be impossible without them – even though they may never come true.

Hope

We LIVE on hope in this life: hell is loss of hope. Never let us say, "There's no hope" – keep hoping – HEAVEN is the fulfilment of all hope.

Charity

Charity is the summary of the Law – the greatest of all the virtues: thus it is the most difficult to exercise. It is easy to say that you love your neighbour as yourself, but how are you responding to the frequent calls on you to be charitable in word and in deed and in attitude. The secret of true charity? To SEE God in everyone and treat them as you would treat Him.

Newness of the Moment

Enthusiasm is based on being able to see and enjoy new things and new people every moment of life – God is constantly revealing Himself: each day is different, each face is different. Enjoy the changing changelessness of God.

Adaptability

Pray often for the grace to be adaptable – to be able to fit in with what is demanded of you here and now, in this situation, with these people. God is constantly calling, be able to answer His call in the proper way at the proper time.

Reverence

Strive to be reverent always, reverent to God, reverent to yourself, reverent to other people. This will cause a true gentleness and meekness which will win souls. "I cannot hear your words because of the thunder of what you ARE."

Dependence

We are entirely dependent on the providence of God. Great evils come of being over-independent. Great strength comes from using GOD to fill what is wanting in us.

Piety

Piety, the sense of the sacred, the love of things which pertain to God is a lovely virtue: teach it to the children. Awe and wonder are part and parcel of the child: turn them to God

The Smile

Life would be quite impossible without a kind of sense of humour. See the funny side – laugh at yourself a lot.

I Know where I'm Going

Always know clearly where you are going and stride out towards the goal – the final goal and those which come in between. My true DIGNITY and strength lie in the fact that God created me for Himself.

Memories

Memories are lovely things to have and to give. Do everything well, make the most of every moment, and you will have no regrets, just happy memories.

Please and Thanks

What precious words these are: much charity is contained therein.

Tremble

Never cease to tremble before God, whilst always remembering that He is a loving Father. Tremble at yourself and what you might do if God is not with you.

Prayer and Conduct

If the standard of your conduct is deteriorating, then look to the standard of your prayer life. All action must start and be motivated by prayer.

Little Things of Life

Nothing is unimportant in this life: every second holds its own charm, its own opportunities, its own challenge, its own love. Nothing in life is trivial.

Learn Quickly

Try to learn soon and quickly, without wasting time about making mistakes in order to learn. Learn a little every day about things, about people – for this is really learning about GOD. I HATE WASTE, waste of time, of talents, of opportunities.

Jigsaw

You are a precious piece in the jigsaw of God's plan: strive, then, to FIT into the proper place – don't have to force yourself where you don't belong. Every piece, your own and others' – is terribly important and completes the picture God has had from the beginning of the world.

A twinge of conscience is a gift from God.



THE APOSTLES' CREED sums up all the articles of our Faith, make it your frequent prayer.

Some of the most wonderful words of Scriptures are contained in the prayer to Our Lady so much used by our forefathers: THE ANGELUS.

Maybe the most natural of all prayers to Our Lady, in a language we really understand, is the lovely prayer of Saint Bernard, THE MEMORARE.

Call often on the Trinity – with the sign of the cross, and the GLORY BE TO THE FATHER.

And for a happy death:

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I give you my heart and my soul.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, assist me in my last agony. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, may I breathe forth my soul in peace with you. AMEN. All hail to Mary in the lovely words of the HAIL, HOLY QUEEN.

Don't forget the blessing before and after the food we eat, in the GRACE BEFORE AND AFTER MEALS.

All praise to God!

Blessed be God.

Blessed be His Holy Name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man.

Blessed be the name of Jesus.

Blessed be His most sacred Heart.

Blessed be His most precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the most Holy Sacrament of the altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most Holy.

Blessed be her holy and Immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be Saint Joseph, her most chaste Spouse.

Blessed be God in His angels and in His saints.

Frequently confess your sins in the words you know so well from the beginning of each Mass: I CONFESS.

AN ACT OF SORROW

O my God, because You are so good, I am very sorry that I have sinned against You, and I will not sin again. AMEN.

AN ACT OF FAITH

O my God I believe in You and all Your Church teaches, because You have said it and Your word is true.

AN ACT OF HOPE

AN ACT OF LOVE

O my God, because You are so good, I love You with all my heart, and for Your sake I also love my neighbour as myself.

FOR THE DEAD

Out of the depths I have cried to Thee O Lord (Psalm 129) Eternal rest give unto them O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. AMEN.

It would be a good thing if these, together with any of your favourite prayers, were learned off by heart: all those above plus little precious ejaculations which join you to God whilst at work:

"Live, Jesus, live, so live in me that all I do is done by Thee."

"O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to Thee."

"O Sacrament most Holy, O Sacrament Divine, all praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine."

I would hope that these prayers are so well known to you that you would wish them to be recited at your deathbed. Make them a PART of you!

Soul of Christ, sanctify me.
Body of Christ, save me.
Blood of Christ, inebriate me.
Water from the side of Christ, wash me.
Passion of Christ strengthen me.

Why am I a member of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul?

We cannot pick and choose the people we have to help. We accept each person who comes our way. Even if our help is squandered and misused, we have done our part. Is the weekly Conference Meeting such that it enriches my Faith?

If it is not, then there is something wrong with it, and it has maybe developed into a mere discussion of "cases". It must be no ordinary meeting, but a holy encounter between men and women who are striving after a closer union with Our Lord.

Am I unobtrusive enough in my membership of the Society?

To work silently, with no wish for recognition or reward has always been a characteristic of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Do I like the sound of my own voice? Do I try to force my opinions on others or grumble about others' methods.

Am I gentle enough in my dealings with the brothers and sisters and those I help?

Our Lord was meek, gentle, understanding and courteous. Our gentlemanliness must extend to one another, to the poor and even the toughest and roughest of people we meet. We show towards them that same courtesy Our Lord Himself would show.

Am I an example to others?

I must be a genuine example to others of living in the Faith of Christ. I must be strong in principle, gentle in its application. But above all, I must practice what I preach and what I stand for.
